Q: What are we releasing?

A: Navigate360 is excited to release a new version of Suite360 Behavior Intervention & Restorative Practices. The new version features a revamp of the Behavior Intervention curriculum, designed to further address behavior challenges in educational settings.

Q: What's new?

A: The new version of Behavior Intervention & Restorative Practices includes the following:

- *New lessons* Hundreds of brand-new lessons to target common behavior infractions. We offer the largest library of behavior intervention lessons available.
- **Tiered lessons** Lessons vary in depth across 3 tiers to help meet students' needs.

• **Restorative practices strategies** – Students will complete open response restorative practices questions, as well as Admit, Apologize, Amend reflection prompts. We also offer Choice Board extension activities for Tier 3 lessons in grades 6-12.

• **New reporting** – A new dashboard with detailed lesson reports for effective monitoring. Track completion statistics, behavioral trends, grade-level usage, and more.

• **Support for facilitators** – Behavior Intervention & Restorative Practices includes a detailed facilitator guide to help implement the program and support program facilitators, ensuring a smooth and simple implementation. In addition, we offer Restorative Practices PD to help educators understand restorative practices strategies.

Q: How is this new version better?

Q: What is included in Behavior Intervention & Restorative Practices?

A: Behavior Intervention & Restorative Practices includes lesson engagement activities (pre/post quizzes and lesson checks), open response pages for reflection and discussion, family letters, Tier 3 choice board activities, detailed lesson and behavior reporting, and an Intervention Facilitator Guide to assist all staff with implementing Behavior Intervention lessons appropriately and effectively.

Q: When will the new version of Behavior Intervention & Restorative Practices be released?

Q: How are the tiered lessons designed to be used?

A: Tier 1 is designed to be used as a preventative and proactive lesson to teach universally expected behaviors. Tier 1 lessons can be assigned to individuals, small groups, or a whole class. Tiers 2 and 3 are designed to provide more intensive instruction, more opportunities for reflection, and more practice with additional strategies for managing behavior. Students who are assigned Tier 2 lessons will also receive Tier 1 instruction, and students assigned Tier 3 lessons will also receive Tier 1 and Tier 2 instruction. Repeated exposure to all parts of the lesson is beneficial for greater retention of the information.

Q: How do students complete the reflection prompts?

A: Schools have 3 choices for how they would like students to complete the reflection prompts. Students can enter their response directly in the lesson, in a fillable PDF, or on loose leaf paper. The default setting is to enter the responses directly into the lesson.



Q: What are the benefits of the reflection prompts?

A: The prompts provide tools for self-reflection, help foster a deeper understanding, and facilitate meaningful discussions.

Q: What is the Choice Board?

A: The choice board is a list of optional hands-on activities for tier 3 lessons in grades 6-12. These activities allow students to use their learning to give back and repair harm that was done by their behavior, increasing ownership and accountability. Students can choose to create a poster, write an essay or poem, create a slideshow, and more to show they understand their behavior and the consequences of continuing that behavior.
